

Nathan Hale Hall of Fame

Mission

It is our goal to recognize Nathan Hale School alumni, employees and volunteers that have distinguished themselves by their contribution in their field of work or study, to the Nathan Hale School Community and to society as a whole. By honoring these positive role models, we hope to provide inspiration to our current students on understanding the value of education and citizenship and the possibilities to which it may lead. The NHHOF is to recognize those who have demonstrated significant accomplishments based upon academic excellence and achievement, career accomplishments, community service, personal excellence and dedication to lifelong learning.

Process

Each year, the Hall of Fame committee will induct 1 new member to the Nathan Hale Hall of Fame.

Criteria Nominees will be recognized for a high level of achievement in a combination of:

- Academic endeavors
- Career excellence
- Service to community

The nominee should also exemplify personal commitment to:

- Good character
- Scholarship
- Leadership
- Service within his/her field of expertise

Nominees must be from one of the following categories:

3 Categories

- 1. Alumni/Former Students:** this category will honor former students of Nathan Hale for their contribution to society, academic achievements and for enhancing the reputation of our school.

2. **Staff Member:** This category will honor Nathan Hale staff members for their contribution to the school, students and education. These nominees must have been Nathan Hale School employees for a minimum of 2 years.
3. **Volunteers:** This category will honor all parents, teachers, coaches and local residents that have excelled in their volunteer work with Nathan Hale. Examples are PTO, mentoring, youth groups, music, band, sports, etc. These nominees can be current or past volunteers.

* The Hall of Fame board has the right to waive qualification standards for nominees by unanimous vote. The Hall of Fame board can induct individuals posthumously.

Voting Committee

All active members of Nathan Hale PTO, the NHS principal and NHS assistant principal will be voting members. Steering committee members cannot vote on any immediate family members that are nominated to the NHHOF. A chairperson will be selected at the September PTO meeting as necessary.

Nomination / Selection Process

After each year's deadline (March 27th), all eligible nomination forms will be shared for review. The voting committee will then meet at the March PTO meeting to review, discuss and vote on the inductees for that year. Voting will be by secret ballot. Each attending steering committee member will vote on their top choices in rank order. The nominee with the most votes will be inducted into the NHHOF.

Nathan Hale Hall of Fame Induction

The NHHOF Induction will be combined with the 8th Grade awards night in June of each year. This will provide the inductees with an impressive audience and will provide inspiration to our current graduates to persevere in their goals and aspirations.

Plaques

Awards will be given to each inductee. One plaque shall be presented to the inductee; the other will be placed outside of the gymnasium on the lower level of the school.
